ABIES ALBA 'HEDGE'

A dark green, spreading bush, it grows about 2" per year. (4)

Stk# 350S. . . . 5" pot \$ 35.00

ABIES ALBA 'MLADA BOESLAV'

A dwarf, mounding bush from the Czech Republic, it will be about 3' wide and 2' tall at fifteen years. (4)

ABIES ALBA 'PYRAMIDALIS'

This dark green, narrow spire grows about 4" per year. (4)

ABIES ALBA 'SCHWARZWALD'

This newer offering is a dark green, low, flat-topped bush that grows about 2" per year. (4)

ABIES BALSAMEA 'EUGENE GOLD'

A dwarf, globose bush with yellow-gold foliage, it grows 1"-2" per year. Plant in partial shade. (3)

ABIES BALSAMEA 'OLD RIDGE'

Growing about 1" per year, this selection develops into a squatly conical, dense little bush. The new growth is pure white in the spring and will burn if not shaded. (3)

ABIES BALSAMEA 'WOLCOTT POND'

Found in Vermont by Greg Williams, this dense, dark green, globose selection grows 1"-2" per year. (3)

ABIES BORISII-REGIS (J.K. GREECE)

A hybrid between *cephalonica* and *alba*, this compact shrub grows about 2" per year and has dark green foliage. (5)

ABIES CONCOLOR 'ARCHER'S DWARF'

A dwarf, conical plant, it grows dense and quite narrow. The needles are powder blue, thin, and strongly recurved. It grows 2"-3" per year. (4)

ABIES CONCOLOR 'CONICA'

This narrow tree with ascending branches grows about 6" per year. A specimen 10' tall might be 4' wide. (4)

ABIES CONCOLOR 'LA VETA'

Discovered as a witches' broom, it grows about 2" a year, becoming a small, flat-topped globe with blue foliage. (4)

ABIES CONCOLOR 'WINTER GOLD'

This small tree has yellow-green foliage that turns bright gold in winter. (4)

ABIES GRANDIS 'VAN DEDEM'S DWARF'

This broad, globose selection is not exceptionally dense. Its foliage is dark green with short needles. Growing 1"-2" per year, a twenty year old plant is about 15" tall by 30" wide. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'BLAUER ESKIMO'

A witches' broom from 'Blauer Pfiff' with the same blue color, this selection becomes a miniature, globose bun. It grows about ¾" per year. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'CIS'

This miniature, dense, globose bush grows about 1" per year and has dark green foliage. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'GELBBUNT'

Found by Gunter Horstmann about 1970, this tree has yellow variegated patches of foliage among the normal green colored foliage. The variegation becomes less pronounced as the tree ages. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'GOLDEN DREAM'

This European selection with bright gold foliage appears to slowly grow into a flat topped bush. Some plants do tend to grow more upright but are still very densely branched. It grows about 3"- 4" per year. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'GREEN CARPET'

A dwarf, somewhat mounding selection, it is not as flat as the name implies. It has good, dark green color and eventually becomes a low, wide bush growing about 1"-2" per year. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'KRISTALKUGEL'

A flat-topped cushion when young, this selection develops a rounded top as it matures. When young, it will grow 1"-2" per year, slowing to less than 1" per year after about five years. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'SILBERKUGEL'

In many ways this is the most distinctive of a group of miniature Korean Firs offered by Coenosium Gardens. The branchlets are slightly twisted, and a specimen will become somewhat flat-topped as it ages. The growth rate is less than 1" per year. (5)

ABIES KOREANA 'SILBERPERLE'

This miniature, globular form has silver and green foliage. As it ages, it will develop a slow growing terminal shoot and become a dense, squat little shrub with a growth rate of just over 2" per year. (5)

ABIES LASIOCARPA 'ALPINE BEAUTY'

A miniature Alpine fir with small, bluish leaves, its yearly growth is less than 1" as it develops into a dense, little cone. (5)

ABIES LASIOCARPA 'DUFLON'

This miniature selection develops into a 6" tall, squatly conical, dense little plant after ten to fifteen years. It will always be wider than high with short, thin, gray-green needles on stubby little branches. (5)

ABIES LASIOCARPA 'LOPALPUN'

An excellent selection for a rock garden, this dense, extremely miniature bun has gray-green foliage. (5)

ABIES LASIOCARPA 'PRICKLY PETE'

Although the parent of this selection was a columnar dwarf form of Rocky Mountain Fir, all of the plants propagated from it have been dense little globes growing less than 1" per year with blue-green foliage. We hope they will eventually grow like the parent plant, but more evaluation time is needed before determining its ultimate size and shape. (5)

ABIES LASIOCARPA 'UTAH'

Apparently becoming a flat-topped bun, this dwarf, green selection grows about 1/2" per year. (5)

ABIES NORDMANNIANA 'GOLDEN SPREADER'

When young, this bright gold fir grows in a nest shape and is quite dwarf. It becomes conical with a rounded top as it ages. It grows up to 2" per year with the terminal often growing up to 3" per year. (6)

ABIES NORDMANNIANA 'JAKOBSEN'

This miniature selection is pillow-shaped with a bare upper surface. It appears to be very hard to maintain, but is well worth the effort. The foliage is dark green and sparse with very thick new growth. It grows about 1" a year. (6)

ABIES PINSAPO 'FATIMA'

A witches' broom from *Abies pinsapo*, this selection becomes a dense mound of gray foliage that grows about 2" per year. (6)

ABIES PINSAPO WB#7

Collected the same time as 'Fatima', this particular plant has yet to be named. It is a slow growing, densely branched selection that becomes a broad, gray-green cushion, growing 1"-2" per year. (6)

ABIES PROCERA 'PESEK'

Slow growing when young, this selection develops into a dense, conical plant with blue foliage with an eventual growth rate of 6"-9" per year. (6)

ABIES VEITCHII 'HEDERGOTT'

Developing into an irregular mound, this dwarf form eventually becomes a bit upright. The silvery undersides of its leaves are often visible, creating a nice bicolor effect on a plant that grows about 1"-2" per year. (3)

ABIES VEITCHII 'HEINE'

This dwarf, spreading plant grows up to 2" per year with occasional end branches of up to 4". Similar to 'Hedergott' but with longer leaves and a lighter green color, it was found by W. Wustemeyer, Schermbeck, Germany about 1986. (3)

ABIES VEITCHII 'RUMBURK'

This new, exceptionally nice cushion has silver and green foliage that grows about 1"- 2" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'BRNO'

This dense, miniature globe with a flattened top grows about 1/2" per year and may be 15" wide by 10" high in twenty-five years. Its foliage is light green with short needles. It is a distinctive miniature plant that forms a low, wide, dense pillow with dark green foliage and pronounced winter buds. It has thin branches and tiny needles. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'DAN'S DWARF'

This miniature plant came from Greg Williams and has been growing in our garden for ten years. It has become a squat, conical, densely branched little bush that grows about 1" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'DUMPY'

Originating as a witches' broom on 'Pygmaea' about 1970 at Red Lodge Nursery in England, this dense, miniature mound grows less than 1" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'EVA'

A miniature form with tiny needles, it develops into a squatly conical little gem of a plant. Its terminal can grow up to 3" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'FORMANEK'

A prostrate selection that is quite dwarf, it develops into a broad mound. The mound might be 3' across and less than 6" high at ten years. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'GOLD DRIFT'

A new selection unlike anything else presently available anywhere. This plant was developed from a sport Bob discovered on a side branch of *Picea abies* 'Reflexa'. The spring growth is lime green but the sun turns it bright gold by late spring. It then remains gold through the winter, becoming gold tipped before the new growth appears in the spring. It can trail over a wall or be staked to become an upright weeper. In the Northwest the full sun causes burning on young plants which disappears as the plant matures. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'HASIN'

A distinctive miniature plant that forms a low, wide, dense pillow with dark green foliage and pronounced winter buds, it grows less than 1/2" per year with thin branches and tiny needles. It is difficult to push a finger into the plant. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'KLUCENICE'

A dwarf, dense, compact globe, it grows 1" per year and at ten years may be 10" wide by 10" high. Its foliage is light green with short needles. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'KLUIS'

This dwarf selection initially grows as a miniature ball. After five to ten years, some upright growth will occur, possibly as much as 6" per year while the rest of the plant maintains its miniature appearance. With age it will become conical and very dense and may be about 3' tall when twenty years old. The foliage is predominantly very short, thin and green. (4)

PICEA ABIES 'KUNRADICE'

This dense, compact, flat-topped globe grows 1" per year with light green foliage. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'MALENA'

A dwarf, globose plant that is very densely branched with large, coarse needles giving it a bumpy outline, it grows about 1" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'NIDIFORMIS KALOUS'

This cultivar develops into a miniature ball with a growth rate of about 1/2" per year. The branchlets are short with protruding winter buds and thin, short, green needles. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'NORKKOPING'

This small, upright tree with bright yellow foliage grows slower and denser than 'Aurea' or 'Aurea Jacobsen'. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'PACHYPHYLLA'

This slow growing,, irregular and open selection has very short, thick, and stiff branches. Its leaves are also very thick and fleshy. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'PERRY'S GOLD'

A slow growing, dense, small tree that tends to be spreading when young, its spring foliage is white to bright yellow becoming green as the season progresses. It does burn in exposed locations in the Northwest and grows up to 6" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'PUSCH'

Anyone who likes 'Acrocona' will just love this selection. Discovered as a witches' broom on 'Acrocona', it is a dwarf plant with miniature cones on the ends of its branches. It becomes broader than high with an irregular outline. The spring cones are bright red. It grows about 3" per year and at ten years may be 2' wide. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'ST. JAMES'

A good choice for a smaller garden, this dark green, dense cushion has a convex top and grows 1"-2" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'SUNCREST'

This globose selection of Norway spruce grows 1"-2" per year with bluish foliage similar to that of *Picea pungens*. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'TOMPA'

A dwarf selection that grows squatly conical and looks much like a broad dwarf Alberta Spruce but with the coarser foliage of *Picea abies*, it will be about 24" high in ten years. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'TUFTY'

A slow growing, irregularly shaped bush with branches shooting off in all directions, its foliage is light green with thin needles. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'WAGNERI'

Wagner's spruce is a congested little globe that grows up to 1" per year. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'VERMONT GOLD'

This plant has the typical 'Repens' growth habit of developing into a wide-spreading, flat-topped bush. Its foliage is bright gold throughout the summer but the Northwest sun will burn it in fully exposed locations. It grows about 2" per year as a grafted plant. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'WICHTEL'

There is some debate as to the origin of this cultivar, but apparently it originated in the Hillier Arboretum near Winchester, England as a diminutive witches' broom on *Picea abies* 'Humilis'. It is the slowest growing selection of *Picea abies* available anywhere.

PICEA ABIES 'WITCHES' BROOD'

This plant has very fine, light green foliage and starts out globular but becomes conical. It is very slow growing and will be about 3' high in fifteen years. (3)

PICEA ABIES 'ZAJECICE'

This true miniature becomes globe shaped with small, thin, dark green needles and grows to softball size in about ten years. The name means "rabbity place" and is a village in the Czech Republic. (3)

PICEA GLAUCA 'BURNING WELL'

This dense, low cushion with gray-green foliage and resinous brown buds grows just over 1" per year. (2)

PICEA GLAUCA 'CECILIA'

Developing into a miniature bun with short needles arranged radially around each branchlet, this selection grows about 1" per year. Its foliage is silver-gray to blue with globular, dark brown buds (2)

PICEA GLAUCA 'DAISY WHITE'

This selection of dwarf Alberta spruce flushes white in the spring and has pale green to cream-tinted foliage through the summer. It will grow 1"-2" per year. (2)

PICEA GLAUCA 'PALECEK'

A dense, globose selection, it grows about 1" per year, becoming 10" wide by 8" high in ten years. Its foliage is blue-green and the name means "small thumb". (2)

PICEA JEZOENSIS 'AUREA'

Discovered and introduced in the 1890's, this plant is still very rare. The gold color of this small tree is best when the plant is young, becoming a bit dull as it matures. It will burn in the full sun as a young plant and may be about 2' tall in ten years. (5)

PICEA X MARIORIKA 'GLAUCA'

A dwarf selection with blue foliage, this hybrid of *mariana* and *omorika* has been developing into a broad shrub with a growth rate of less than 4" per year. (5)

PICEA OMORIKA 'ELISABETH'

A dense, conical plant with the shape of 'Nana', it grows about 4" per year whereas 'Nana' can grow over 1' per year in the Northwest. (4)

PICEA OMORIKA 'GOTELLI WEEPING'

This tree grows over 1' per year and will be less than 5' wide when it is forty feet tall. The original tree was in the Gotelli Collection at the U.S. National Arboretum but died several years ago. It is much superior to the form that is sold as 'Pendula'. (4)

PICEA OMORIKA 'GUNTER'

This dense, globose shrub has a growth rate faster than 'Pimoko' and may be 2' wide and 18" high at ten years. (5)

PICEA OMORIKA 'KUCK WEEPING'

There are many different forms of weeping Serbian Spruce in the United States and Europe. 'Bruns Weeping' is a strict weeper but 'Kuck Weeping' is the narrowest one discovered up to now. It is a fast growing tree requiring little room in the garden. Its bicolored foliage is not quite as distinctive as that of 'Bruns Weeping', tending more toward dark green. It grows about 1' per year. (4)

PICEA OMORIKA 'PENDULA BRUNS'

Possibly the narrowest of the weeping forms of Serbian spruce, this selection has the same bicolored foliage typical of the species and grows up to 1' or more per year. (4)

PICEA OMORIKA 'PENDULA MAJOR'

Bob first saw this plant growing in England and it caught his eye because it was not an upright form. It tends to grow broader than high with pendulous foliage. It will grow about 1' per year. (5)

PICEA OMORIKA 'PEVE TIJN'

A bright gold sport from *Picea omorika* 'Nana', it grows just like the parent plant but at half the rate and with exceptionally bright foliage that does not burn in the sun. Globose when young, it eventually takes on a dense, conical shape. (5)

PICEA OMORIKA 'PIMOKO'

A dwarf, dense, broadly globose plant with twigs possessing numerous brown buds and typical silver and blue foliage, it grows less than 2" per year, becoming a dense cushion about 2' wide in fifteen years. (4)

PICEA OMORIKA 'POSTORNA'

We have several young plants of 'Postorna' growing under different conditions and they all grow less than 1" per year, developing into tight little globes. It is the smallest of our dwarf forms of *Picea omorika*. (5)

PICEA OMORIKA 'TREBLITSCH'

This dense little cushion has coarse foliage evidenced by short, straight needles sticking straight out from the branches unlike any other miniature *Picea omorika* cultivar. It grows just over 1" per year. (4)

PICEA ORIENTALIS

'MT. VERNON'

This extremely dwarf globe has dark green foliage and is very densely branched. Our thirty year old mother plant is about 36" wide and 18" high. (5)

PICEA ORIENTALIS

'PROFESSOR LANGNER'

This dense, miniature bun has small, thin, emerald green needles. Gradually remove the understock over several years to get this plant established. It grows less than 1" per year. (5)

PICEA ORIENTALIS

'SILVER SEEDLING'

This small tree with sulphur-white foliage burns in the full sun. In the shade this plant is dark green with white tipped needles. Older plants grow 4"-6" per year. Gradually remove the understock over several years to get this plant established. (5)

PICEA ORIENTALIS

'SKYLANDS'

A golden form that burns in the full sun when young, older plants grow fairly fast and tolerate full sun. It grows about 9" per year unless stunted by the full sun. (5)

PICEA ORIENTALIS

'TOM THUMB GOLD'

This witches' broom from 'Skylands' has all of the foliage characteristics of 'Skylands' but forms a miniature bun. It needs the understock left on for up to three years and should not be put in complete shade. It grows less than 1" per year. (5)

PICEA PUNGENS

'BLAUKISSEN'

This dense, low mound with small, blue needles grows about 1" per year and is perfect for the smaller garden. (3)

PICEA PUNGENS 'BLUE PEARL'

Our plants are developing into nice little blue mounds that grow to a diameter of about 15" in ten years. (2)

This selection is too new and rare to have any large specimens to observe. Another Jerry Morris discovery, it appears to be a dwarf, cushion-shaped selection with blue foliage growing more congested than 'Platte Best Blue'. (2)

PICEA PUNGENS 'DONNA'S RAINBOW'

This dwarf, dense, conical form has terminal shoots that stand straight up with the foliage arranged in such a way as to give a foxtail like appearance to the branches. It will be less than 3' high in ten years, and is spindly when young. (2)

PICEA PUNGENS 'EARLY CONES'

This dense, miniature bush with thin, blue needles has many tiny cones on the tips of the branchlets. (3)

PICEA PUNGENS 'HALEY'S BLUE'

A congested bun with bright blue needles, this selection was found by Jerry Morris and named for his niece. (2)

PICEA PUNGENS 'HERMANN NAUE'

Anyone wanting a dwarf, shrubby, blue conifer with many cones scattered about on the ends of its branches needs to look no further. Developing into an irregular mound, this cultivar is bright blue and densely branched with abundant, light colored cones scattered over its surface. (2)

PICEA PUNGENS 'KUTJEBO'

Growing about 1" per year, this cultivar becomes a dense globe that eventually develops a slightly conical shape. (2)

This selection is too new and rare to have any large specimens to observe. Found by Jerry Morris, it appears to be a dwarf, cushion-shaped selection with blue foliage. (2)

This selection was made in Hungary, and it is very choice. It is a tight little ball with blue foliage that grows about 1" per year. (3)

This selection is too new and rare to have any large specimens to observe. A Jerry Morris find, it appears to be a dwarf, cushion-shaped selection with blue foliage. (2)
